

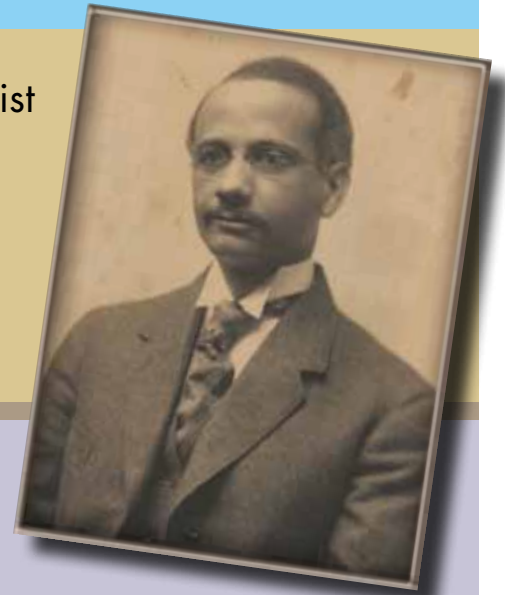


Carter Fuller Memory Screening Day
